A Gathering of Eagles



Auburn Homes, Chaska, hosted "A Salute to Our Veterans" on Sunday, February 16th. This solemn and tear-filled ceremony thanked each veteran residing at Auburn, Chaska, recognizing their military history. The United States Marine Corps, represented by LCPL Rachel Murray and LCPL Enrique Hernandez, honored each Veteran as their military experience was shared with everyone present. Children, grandchildren, nieces, and other relatives read with great pride the history of their family's veteran hero.

These men and women veterans represented more than 91 years of military service to our country. Their histories included a United States Marine having been involved in the horrific fighting in the taking of Guadalcanal, Tarawa, the Gilbert Islands, Saipan, and Tinian. During these battles, this veteran lost his entire unit with the exception of himself and his Commanding Officer. An Air Force jet pilot flying more than 100 combat missions, receiving the Silver Star and 18 air medals for heroism in Vietnam. A Private in the United States Army, who helped build a pipeline from India, through the jungles of Burma, and into China in order to supply fuel for land vehicles and aircraft, enabling the allied forces to attack Japan. Two veterans were in route to attack the Japanese homeland when they learned with great joy that the Japanese had surrendered. There were many more individual experiences shared during this moving event. Regardless of each veteran's personal story, all of our Auburn veterans gave up part of their lives for the freedom of our country.

Sara Engelhardt, granddaughter of one of our heroes, sang the Star Spangled Banner. Lynda Ryski provided military music, and Pastor Mike Eder of the Chaska Moravian Church added prayers for the veterans and our current military families.

This program was the idea of Auburn volunteer, Michael Petersen. Michael is a 27-year Navy Veteran. As a Navy Pilot, he flew 269 combat missions in Viet Nam, receiving 17 air medals, including the Purple Heart. Michael and his wife, Suzan live in Chaska. Suzan's mother has called Auburn Courts her home for the past two years.

Star Society Provides Opportunities for Planned Gifts

The Star Society at Auburn Homes and Services was created to recognize and thank benefactors who have included Auburn Homes in their will or estate planning. Most of these legacy gifts come in the form of a simple bequest, included in a will. However, creating a clear, well prepared estate plan can be an opportunity to improve the tax implications for your own retirement plan, increase the gift you leave to your family/loved ones, and is an incredibly powerful way to leave a lasting legacy with any organization(s) that is/are close to your heart.

In the coming year, the Moravian Care Foundation will be refocusing on the planned giving program for Auburn Homes and Services. Our hopes are to help people/families with their personal estate planning and possibly growing the endowment for Auburn Homes. This would include our Chaplaincy Endowment Fund.

Some of you may already have included Auburn Homes and Services in your will or estate plan. If so, please contact the Foundation. It will help us update our records, clarify our long-term planning, inspire others to consider including Auburn Homes and Services in their estate planning, and allow us to recognize and thank you for your partnership with the people and mission of Auburn.

Listed below are various examples of income-generating gifts and deferred planned gifts.

Gift Annuities: A gift annuity is a type of gift that provides an income to the donor(s). This gift structure will begin making fixed annual payments to the donor(s) for life and, if desired, for the life of another beneficiary. Upon the death of the last beneficiary, the remaining funds will serve as a gift to Auburn Homes and Services, and/or an organization of your choice.

Charitable Remainder Trusts: There are various types of charitable remainder trusts, all of which will allow donors to provide income for themselves or others for life, or a term of years, while still making a generous gift to Auburn Homes and Services, and/or an organization of your choice. Donors of charitable remainder trusts transfer assets – usually cash, securities, or real estate – to a trustee of their choice. During the term the trustee invests the assets. When the term ends, the remaining principal passes to Auburn Homes and/or the organization of your choice.

Bequests: The simplest and most common way to make a planned gift is to include Auburn Homes as a beneficiary in your will. The amount of your gift can be a specific dollar amount or a percentage of the remainder of your estate. Simple language is available upon request.

Life Insurance: Designating Auburn Homes as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy can be a smart and easy way to make a planned gift. Upon the insured's death, Auburn Homes would receive all or a portion of the life insurance proceeds. Another option is to make Auburn Homes the owner of the policy and to make the annual payments to Auburn Homes as a tax deductible gift.
